Rider Level Testing Information

This program is a national program run through Equine Canada that rewards all riders for advancing their learning with certificates of achievement. It gives the riders the opportunity to increase their knowledge in horsemanship through theory sessions, clinics and workshops.

The Learn To Ride Program is open to all riders. There are 8 levels that students can progress through. Higher level students do not need to start at level 1 we will assess you to place you in the appropriate level.

There is a written, stable management, and riding portion to each test. Students who join the Horsemanship Club can spend the winter attending sessions to prepare for the testing. Rider level testing will be held in May of 2012.

This is an excellent program for students to participate in and allows them to set clearly defined goals for reaching the next level in their riding and horsemanship skills.
