# Pickering Horse Centre Rules & Regulations



#### **MEMBERSHIPS**

1. Any rider(s) entering any class/division at this horse show must be current members in good standing of Ontario Equestrian (OE). They must supply original or copy of their OE membership card, valid for the current year, at the show.



- 1. Entries and applicable fees must be received on or before the closing date to avoid post entry fees. CLOSING DATE: Sunday prior to show. Entries received after this date will be charged a \$25.00 Late Fee.
- 2. Refunds: Administration and stall fees are not refundable, No Exceptions. Entry fees will be returned if cancelled by email 24 hours prior to the first class entered with proper medical documentation. Any classes/divisions entered but not completed will be charged. There will be no refund for classes scratched after the class start. You may change from one class/division to another at no additional charge as long as it has been cleared by the show secretary.
- 3. No entries will be accepted without Credit Card Authorization or payment by cash/cheque. Etransfers will also be accepted, using the password 'Pickering'. No numbers will be issued to any horse or rider for whom an entry has not been fully completed. All unpaid fees will be considered an outstanding account until paid in full. No entry will be accepted for exhibitors not in good standing.
- 4. Show Management reserves the right to change or amend show scheduling.
- 5. Stabling requests must be accompanied with an Entry. Stabling fees are prepaid and non-refundable. Shavings must be ordered with Stabling requests.



#### REGULATIONS

- 1. All motorized vehicles may be operated by fully licensed drivers only. Vehicles will be impounded by the competition and also held liable if this rule is not enforced.
- 2. Vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. There is no parking on the roads or barn areas.
- 3. Horses must be bathed in wash rack areas only. These areas are for washing horses only.
- 4. All visiting dogs must be kept on a leash and all owners must abide by the "Poop & Scoop" law. PHC reserves the right to request owners to remove any dog from property if dog is a nuisance, disruptive or aggressive.
- 5. There is absolutely no grey water drainage allowed on the facility grounds.
- 6. Horses remaining on the property overnight must have an assigned stall. No horses are permitted to be kept in trailers or temporary corrals overnight.






# Pickering Horse Centre Rules & Regulations



#### **GENERAL**

- 1. Current EQUESTRIAN CANADA rules will govern all classes.
- 2. To compete in the under saddle class, a horse must complete at least one course over fences with the exception of the 2'6/2'9 Hunter Division.
- 3. After being eliminated for a fall, the rider may not remount in the ring.
- 4. Junior competitors must wear proper fitting, approved protective headgear, with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on competition or event grounds. Approved headgear meets the ASTM (American Society for Testing Materials) standards and displays the SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) seal. The British standard, BSI is also acceptable.
- 5. Headgear: Anyone mounted on a horse must wear ASTM or BSI approved helmets, with safety harness correctly fastened at all times while mounted on the competition grounds.
- 6. Proper show attire, including jackets, is required for all hunter and equitation divisions and classes. Jumpers are permitted to show without show attire.
- 7. Management reserves the right to limit or close the entries of any classes or divisions in an effort to adhere to the timetable
- 8. All divisions are open to all ages of riders.
- 9. Back numbers must be worn by all riders while mounted.
- 10. All entry forms must be signed by the competitor if they are an adult, and must have a parent/guardian signature for juniors. Coaches/Trainers are not allowed to sign for competitors. No competitor will be allowed to show without the required signature and will be liable for administration/scratch fees.
- 11. Code Of Conduct: It is inappropriate to shout instructions or critique a rider as they are in competition. Providing guidance in a normal speaking voice when the rider is near the in-gate is acceptable. Shouting instructions is very distracting. This is against the Equestrian Canada rules of conduct.
- 12. Year End Awards Will be awarded for the top riders of all divisions. These will be presented at the final show of the season. Riders or a representative must be present at the final show in order to receive awards. Points will be tabulated following riders, not horses. Riders must participate in a minimum of 50% of shows where the division is offered. Points will be posted on the PHC website.



#### **Equestrian Canada Statement of Principle**

EQUESTRIAN CANADA, the National Federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

EQUESTRIAN CANADA is committed to:

Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, is a primary consideration in all activities.

Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment.

Ensuring that owner, trainer, exhibitors and their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose.

Providing for the continuous wellbeing of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure.

Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare.

Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices.

Requiring owners, trainers and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions.

Reviewing, revising and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses. The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a reasonable person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

All participants at the PHC Skills Development shows are expected to abide by this statement of Principle.

All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations.

EC and the PTSOs share a vision to see every equestrian coach and instructor licensed and certified by 2025. To meet this goal, formal requirements to hold a valid Coach Licence to coach at competitions will be phased in as follows:

- $\bullet$  In 2021, it will be recommended that coaches be licensed at all EC sanctioned competitions.
- In 2022, coaches will need to have a Registered Coach Status at all EC sanctioned competitions.
- In 2023, coaches will need to have a Registered Coach Status at all EC Silver & Bronze sanctioned competitions. Coaches will need to have a Licensed Coach Status at all EC Platinum & Gold sanctioned competitions.
- In 2024, coaches will need to have a Licensed Coach Status at all EC sanctioned competitions.
- In 2025, coaches will need to have a Licensed Coach Status and Certification at all EC sanctioned competitions.
